	Canal bridge, Seend Cleeve. Councillors advised that work is ongoing, and a finish date of June looks most likely. Post meeting note: Clir Murch has met with Paul Kelly, C & RT. It is expected that the concrete capping will be laid by the end of the first week of April, and the bridge open again by the end of April.	
	High Street crossing. Quote received from Phil Dyke in the sum of £8165 + VAT. A grant request to CATG to be submitted on line. Quote to be requested from Ringway.	Clerk
	Worton PC & C20 proposals. Email received from Elizabeth Read, Clerk, Worton PC. Worton submitted concerns and suggestions, these were considered at the CATG meeting in January, but were not allocated any officer time and no prospect of action. The issue will be considered at the CATG on the 6 April, but unlikely to gain a different result. We will continue to try to get action on the C20, and will write to Cllr Whitehead.	
	Defibrillation unit in village. Minutes of SLRF committee meeting 16 Dec received from Steve Vaux: "Seend PC has requested trustee opinion on siting of an automatic defibrillator. It was suggested that the equipment should be located at the Seend Community Centre, which had more frequent use, and where better weather cover is	Clerk

	afforded by the building entrance porch." It was agreed to go ahead and investigate installation at the Community Centre.	
	Oriel House hedges. These now appear to have been cut back. The hedge around the field at the top of Bollands Hill (recently sold) still needed to be cut back. Cllr Seed would ascertain the new owner, and he and Mr Rigg would go and investigate. Councillor profile in Spotlight. The first (Mrs A'Bear) does not appear to have been included. 	Caravan at G & S Patios. Email received from S. Jenkins. There are two caravans and two portacabins on the above site. I visited the site this afternoon where I noticed that they have one night watchman mobile next to the road, the mobile located the other side of the hedge replaced the dilapidated portacabin that was previously there and is used for rest-room facilities for employees and he has the office portacabin. The cladded structure is a shed and does not require consent. Therefore there is no breach at the site.	
	It is understood that there is no permission for permanent residence at the site, the Clerk to check with the Enforcement Officer.	Clerk
	Tree matters. The Clerk had followed this matter up with both the Tree Warden and Wiltshire Highways. Email received from Stuart Renfrew, Community Co-ordinator. "In respect of the vegetation cut back there appear to have been three different sets of works carried out there. The first was your contractor with a chainsaw who cleared the immediate Southern boundary of the allotments. Secondly, our highways tractor flail cut the highway side of the hedge / tree line following a complaint that the allotment beds were not receiving enough sunlight. The work was carried out after consultation with the County Ecologist and Highways Tree Engineer using standard flailing equipment which is used by most every agricultural hedge cutting contractor. Subsequent to that flail cut it appears that a number of the saplings / trees that were left in situ have been felled with a chain or bow saw. This was not ourselves as neither Steve Smith nor the tractor driver have access to a chain or bow saw and neither were any other Wiltshire Council contractors sent to this site." Allotment holders have confirmed they had not requested this work to be undertaken. This matter to be investigated further and a letter sent once responsibility for the action confirmed, then back to next meeting.	Clerk & A. Heatley
Neighbourhood Plan update	Mrs A'Bear advised that the Housing Needs Survey has now been delivered to all households in the village, and should be returned by 11 April; the costs are being met by Wiltshire Council. There is a further NP meeting on 31 March. Wiltshire Council has now appointed a Link Officer (Victoria Burvill), who will be coming to the next meeting in April. Mrs A'Bear stressed that the NP traffic group and the SRSI are two separate entities; proposals for road safety measures have to go through due process - CATG and AB.	
Lye Field Play Equipment	The document sent by the Seend Lye Recreation Field had been circulated to all Councillors prior to the meeting. The current equipment was donated by Seend Playgroup, and it was understood that the maintenance of the equipment was the responsibility of the SLRF. The last RoSPA inspection report on 4 Sept 2015 awarded a risk rating of high. Councillors recognised the need for play equipment, but did not accept that the responsibility for provision and maintenance of play equipment rests with Wiltshire Council and Seend PC. The likely cost of provision for new equipment could be £30-40K; the SITA Trust could make a grant under their "Small Projects" fund arrangement. Cllr Seed suggested that the SLRF could apply for funding from Melksham Area Board, in order to cover the cost of the remedial works required, and an early application in April is advisable. The PC does not have any provision in their current budget for remedial work or removal of existing items. The Clerk to advise SLRF.	Clerk
Highways/ road safety issues	Members of the public present at the meeting expressed the wish for a meeting/workshop, in order to clarify a co-ordinated approach to road safety in Seend. It was stressed that this must be inclusive of all areas of the village, not just the A361 High Street. The Clerk advised that she had written to Wiltshire Concrete concerning use of designated lorry routes, and alleged increased costs of using the A365 rather than the A361, and early morning timings of journeys. The Vice-Chairman again stressed that that all highways matters must be co-ordinated through the Parish Council, members of the public present agreed to that.
