

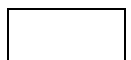
SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 28th June 2022. This meeting was held in the Community Centre.

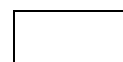

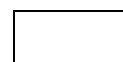

2022/114 Local Councillor's Matters	<p>Devizes Gateway Devizes Gateway (The proposed new Railway Station at Lydeaway) has received additional funding to allow a further detailed study and proposed train timetable to be undertaken. This is expected to be completed within this financial year. The project will require civil works at Westbury to facilitate additional trains to support the new station</p> <p>Local Cycling & Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWHIP) Devizes is included within the new action plan. However, Seend is outside the current plan and so will not benefit from the initial investment. There is a consultation website being set up. 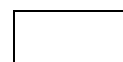

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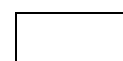
