

2022/60 Local Councillor's Matters	1. WCC Highways Cllr Reay explained that WCC has decided to put more emphasis and funding behind what was formally known as the Community Area Transport Group (CATG) and it will be renamed to become the Local Highways & Footpaths Infrastructure Group (LHFIG). The reorganisation is focused on giving local Area Boards and Parish Councils greater control over local priorities for their neighbourhoods. More funding is going to be made available for Area Boards to support this initiative. 2.Homes for Ukrainian Refugees Around 1,500 households registered for the Homes for Ukraine scheme in Wiltshire. Currently 288 homes have been matched with 794 individuals		
	willishire. Currently 288 nomes have been matched with 794 individuals and 307 visas have been issued. Approximately 400 refugees have arrived in Wiltshire. There have been 57 school applications, (40 primary and 17 secondary) with 3 pupils already starting school and more expected to join classes after Easter. WCC are helping the schools prepare for this. Wiltshire is one of the highest unitary authorities in the country to receive visa applications and has drafted in additional support to carry out the necessary checks including accommodation, welfare and suitability checks.
