Methodology

An Overall 'how'

This site assessment methodology avoids scoring/ranking matrixes which can be difficult to defend and potentially misleading. It follows a methodology used successfully for other Neighbourhood Plan groups and Local Authority site allocations, and draws key points from the Wiltshire Local Plan methodology. This is the start of the process, further more detailed information, additional assessments and technical advice will be needed.

Desktop Assessment before going to site

- You may not be able to answer all the questions on Form A. Complete those you can, other answers can be added later.
- Use the 7 site URS assessment forms and the Wiltshire SHELAA 2017 as a basis for this
 desktop review, but review critically, all comments should be based on evidence.
- Not all boxes or topics in the form apply to all sites. Please use your judgement on those that are not relevant. If necessary just mark N/A for Not Applicable.
- For each site you will need copies for all in the survey group of the forms on pages 1-8 and some maps*.
- * You are subscribers to Parish Online and can get highly detailed maps from there. The website also has a simple area measurement tool if you need it:
- Go to tools.
- Chose measurement tool.
- Click a corner of the site, click at next corner or change in angle.
- Continue until you are back to first corner.
- Click polygon ikon under 'Object Editing Tools' on the box to the right
- The approximate area appears in the small box above.

On site tasks

- Each site would ideally be assessed by a small group of people.
- The approach we prefer is for 1 member of the Steering Group to take 1 site each and to then find 2 or 3 other people to go and look at the site together.
- The others can usefully include someone who lives by/near a site but not more than 1.
- For each site assessment, there are four forms to be completed.
- Read through all the forms before going out on site, just to be sure that it all makes sense. For forms B and C it is possible to fill in some information before going out, adding to, checking and

perhaps changing this once actually looking at a site.

- You will also need at least one clipboard and pens/pencils.
- It is always good to take a few photos. Any photos, or a link to them, should also be kept.
- All in the group can contribute but one final, agreed form is all that is needed for the records.
- Once assessments are complete, they should be kept in a folder ready for the next stage of site selection. Ideally, scan each set of completed forms.

Next Steps

- This process will most likely identify information gaps or gaps in the assessment that mean that
 a decision on site suitability cannot be made e.g. without an understanding impact of a
 potential development site on the conservation area and its setting a judgement cannot be
 made; similarly highways access potential is likely to require specialist advice.
- Additional evidence will then need to be commissioned or gathered e.g. baseline ecology surveys may be needed, landscape or heritage assessments of the site undertaken, utility companies or the local education authority may need to be contacted to see if there are any issues which could make the site unviable.
- Site suitability should be discussed as part of a wider group, with input from Wiltshire planners and your consultants.
