2020/40 Community Governance Review Update	1. We have learnt from Jonathon Seed that at the Community Governance Review committee meeting (public) it was decided that they would not be recommending the boundary change. This is good news for the time being. They are likely to look at it again in the future.	
	2. The next stage of this review will be the formal consultation on the draft recommendations of the Electoral Review Committee which would have been presented at a series of public consultation evenings in May. But we must assume that these will not now take place. We await to hear from Democratic Services what will happen next.	
2020/41 Highway Matters - Update	1. <u>High Street Road resurfacing</u> – this will be carried out on 23rd April 9am- 3pm (1 day). I am not sure if this for the full resurfacing of the High Street or further patching work.	
	2. <u>CATG Updates</u> . As the meeting on 24 <sup>th</sup> March was cancelled. Notes were prepared showing what actions had been taken since the last meeting in December. See below.	
	2.1 <u>Church Crossing</u> – coloured surface. Work complete and final account agreed at £690.03. An underspend of £104.97. CATG had already agreed to contribute £600 (the previous underspend on Phase 1). Parish to be invoiced for £90.03. Awaiting Invoice and then issue closed.	
	2.2 <u>Pedestrian Crossing sign</u> – installed. Work complete and final account settled at £180.44. An overspend of £80.44. <u>Issue closed</u> .	
	2.3 <u>Village Gateways</u> Issue 9-19-6 – Seend Parish – request for Gateway features (white gates) at Seend Cleeve, Sells Green, Bell Hill, Seend village (A361). Highways has visited each of these sites with members of the Parish Council. The Parish no longer wish to pursue white gates as they feel that the cost	

	outweighs the potential benefits. Instead the Parish wish to pursue a new nameplate with road safety message at New Buildings. This could also feature a SLOW marking / or faux cattle grid painted on the carriageway. For further CATG discussion:	
	<ul> <li>2.4 <u>Speed Limit Request for Bollands Hill</u></li> <li>Issue 9-19-7 – Request for a Speed Limit Review on Bollands Hill to A365</li> <li>Speed limit reviews are undertaken over an entire route to ensure consistency and are charged at £2,500. The C20, from A365 to B3098 at Market Lavington was last reviewed in 2012/13.</li> <li>A site for a Metro count has been identified and the survey has been ordered. Results awaited.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>2.5 <u>Bell Hill – Improved Signage</u></li> <li>Issue 9-19-12 – Seend Bell Hill – concerns that drivers are failing to giveway at crossroads (northbound)</li> <li>At a site meeting it was agreed that a SLOW marking could be provided by the Advance Give Way sign. Other minor changes to the road markings could be made as and when surfacing work takes place. Cost of SLOW would be £100 including temporary traffic management. For further CATG discussion.</li> </ul>	
	2.6 <u>Seend Cleeve junction warning signs requested</u> Issue 9-20-2 - Seend Bollands Hill – request for junction warning signs on approach to the Seend Cleeve turning New Issue submitted by Seend Parish Council. Ball park estimate for 2 signs, plus temporary traffic management = £600. For further CATG discussion:
