# Seend Trust and Community Centre – summary of key events 2023/24

## **Maintenance and improvement of facilities**

- Essential electrical and boiler maintenance has been the focus during this last 12 months. Looking ahead, the plumbing is now starting to need more urgent attention to allow better heating control in the winter along with looking at energy efficiency measures such as lighting.
- Grass cutting continued (thanks to Michael Johnson) and outside area kept tidy (thanks to Tessa, John, Fritz and many others) We also have had a new member join our Friday maintenance team, Paul Emery, from Seend Cleeve.
- Maintenance tasks include renovating and painting exterior woodwork and gutters, repointing the patio.
- We have updated the ticketing system used for online events Ticket Tailor & Ticket Source
- New tables were purchased for the Peter Fisher Hall.
- A new signboard in the car park was designed and constructed by Frank
  Teasdale. This presents a more professional and welcoming view of the Centre
  to visitors, hirers and the general public.
- New office equipment and tills were installed. Some kitchen equipment has been replaced, coffee machines for 1<sup>st</sup> Friday
- We have erected the new honour boards for the skittles teams.
- We are just in the process of purchasing our own Juke Box & Pool Table.

#### **Finance**

- Huge thanks to David Purdy for handling the finances over the last 12 months and providing a smooth handover to the new finance team.
- We have now employed a part time bookkeeper to handle the day to day financial transactions & payroll etc which is an endless task for a volunteer, many of you will know Elaine Davies who has connections to the village and local area – she is a great addition to the team.
- In addition to this we have now managed to secure a Treasurer so welcome Geoff Burgess to the committee as Treasurer. Geoff is a local gentleman with great financial acumen across several businesses in his working career and across other clubs and groups.

- With the majority of the bookkeeping outsourced we can now focus on looking at grants to help maintain and improve the overall facilities.
- Bar trade has continued to recover this year and, thanks to Tom Redman's skilled negotiations with suppliers, gross profit has increased. Both the Club and the Trust now have £50k cash in the bank, (many years ago, £50k was a minimum threshold Max Bolton recommended should be kept at all times as a safety buffer in case of emergency – however this figure should probably be more like £55-60k given inflation over the last few years).
