

## **RNLI House to House and Devizes Flag Day Collection: May 2016**

Thank you everyone from Seend, Seend Cleve, Martinslade and Bulkington for giving your time and effort to collect for the Life Boats. Here are the results. The figures in brackets show last years totals. Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number.

The overall total – flag day + village collections was £3900 – down on last year by about £2000. In the village, we collected £439.25 (£464.43) – 5.4% lower than last year. The Flag Day in Devizes raised £682.60 (£759.48) 10% down on last year. This was partly because we had far fewer collectors available this year. The average per person on flag day last year was £25.32; this year (with fewer collectors) it was £28.56. So – despite the lower number of collectors, we did very well indeed. Thank you once again, everyone, for another outstanding effort for a worthy cause supported wholly by charitable contributions.

This has been my last time for organising the Flag Day and village collection. Having done it for 14 years, I think the time has come for a new person to take over the flag day. Regarding the village collection, the RNLI policy now is that there will not be any future village collections.

Thank you for the support you have given over the 14 years – not only those who still collect but those who have helped in the past. I have greatly appreciated your support – both for me and the RNLI. ## **Christian Aid Collection May 15th – 21st**

Ethiopia has been suffering its worst drought for 30 years. Christian Aid sent £50,000 to help some of the most vulnerable members in the hardest-hit communities, such as feeding more than 4,000 children whose families are unable to give them even one meal a day and making sure that 700 children have access to safe drinking water. In the days before the start of Christian Aid week the focus shifted. Torrential rain caused landslides and flooding, with an estimated displacement of 200,000 people. Responding to such cruel quirks of fate is fairly typical of the work done by the emergency branch of Christian Aid operating worldwide.

It is therefore especially pleasing to report a further improvement in our collection which raised £1442.00, a 28% increase on last year. This was mainly due to Poulshot joining but 7% more – over £80 - was collected in Seend and Bulkington. Many thanks are due to all those giving so generously, especially those increasing their donations or giving for the first time and to those able to complete Gift Aid forms. Nearly one half of contributions were gift aided, also an increase, and the 25% extra income generated raised the total for Christian Aid by over £160 to £1608.45.

Particular thanks to the collectors who generously give of their time each year, virtually the same team once again on the same rounds making it a more familiar and sociable exercise for everyone involved. Special thanks to Tina Yockney who joined us for the first time. Spotlight as usual gave us a flying start in terms of informing everyone and inserting 720 envelopes into the magazine. It makes it so much easier for contributors to prepare in advance, especially completing the Gift Aid slip, whilst those on holiday in Christian Aid week can return their envelopes before departure or on their return.

This is a record total for Seend and Bulkington and now with Poulshot we can look forward to next year with confidence. Christian Aid week will be May 14<sup>th</sup> - 20<sup>th</sup> in 2017.

## **SEEND PARISH NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN STEERING GROUP**

Since the update last month this group has been busy. We have circulated all Chairs of **Stakeholder Organisations** (interest groups with responsibility for a community asset or other group activity), with a request that they confer with their committees and draw up a list of ideas they would like to see included in a realistic wish list for the parish. **Thank you to all those who have responded but we still await replies from others.** We welcome fresh ideas so please contribute to that if you can. The next job is to repeat the exercise with the **Businesses** that operate within our parish. The **Area Designation Consultation** period closes on 30/6/2016 and provided there have been no objections or snags found, the first stage of our Neighbourhood Plan Development will have been completed. Do check the website for confirmation after 30/6/2016.

The draft report from Wiltshire Council as to the outcome of the **Rural Housing Needs Survey** has just come in, indicating a return of 42% with 214 replies. This

represents a good response so thank you to all who did as requested. Presently further details are confidential until confirmed, which they will be through the summer, so if you are interested do please check the Parish Council website as there will be no more information in Spotlight until October. The outcome will be on the Parish Council website for various reasons, as it comes under their umbrella not ours.

The **Parish Highways Workshop** took place on Thursday 9th June 2:00pm – 9:00pm. at the Irene Usher Pavilion. About 60 parishioners attended and offered a good number of views relating to all aspects of the roads we use within the Parish. These ideas will be reflected in the more comprehensive survey that will go out to you all later in the year. ## CHURCH AND CHAPEL NEWS

### **Maureen's Ramblings.....**

It takes some courage these days to admit that you are a Christian and that you go to church. At a lunch recently I was asked what my job was. I had the response, "do you actually believe that stuff?" from a new acquaintance across the table. People turn toward me and I searched for a profound and gentle response. It was time, yet again, to defend my faith.....

That situation got me thinking. Are we able to give a defence of why we believe what we believe and are we able to talk confidently, gently and non-confrontationally to others about our faith? At its core, faith is about three things. **Faith is an explanation.** It is our framework for how we make sense of the world. Is our existence meaningless or is there some purpose behind why we are here? Secondly, **faith is a confidence** that our belief of how the world works has integrity and makes sense. Thirdly, **faith is an action.** The way we live our lives reflects the explanation that we hold to be true. As Christians, our explanation of the world is that there is a loving God who wants us to be in relationship with him. Our confidence comes through our experience of God, through the evidence of the beauty and the complexity of creation and through the revelation of Jesus in the Bible and the church. Our lives reflect this explanation in the way we live; the centrality of worship and prayer in our lives and the way we love and serve others.

But what of those who don't share my Christian faith? Well they have faith too. In fact, we all live by faith. We all have an explanation that we are confident in and which helps us make the daily decisions that guide and make sense of our lives. For example, when someone tells me that they are an atheist, my response could be "Wow – that's interesting! Tell me about your faith". "But I don't have faith. I am an atheist". "Of course you have faith. I look at the world and at my life experience and I conclude that there is a God. You look at the world and at your life experience and you conclude that there is no God". I cannot prove God to you but I have faith that there is a God. You can't prove that there is no God but you have faith that there is no God! So share with me how you have come to your conclusion and let me share with you how I have come to mine".

I love to have such conversations. They are always learning times for me. I wonder if, in our desire to be loving and inclusive (and our fear of conflict and confrontation!), we fail as Christians to engage and inspire others to explore something that is exciting and life affirming for us. We need to allow God to use us in helping others think through whether their logic really is as fool proof as they think it is. For example, when someone explains that their faith is in science, or in only what they can see and measure and nothing else, we could ask them if they have ever had any spiritual experiences or whether love ever seems to be more than just a chemical reaction in the brain? Part of my response to those at lunch was "how can you not believe in Jesus?" - a question which sparked an interesting debate! I think it is time to be pro-active!

## SEEND METHODIST CHURCH

Dear Friends,

New Ministers like me get quite a bit of 'training' about time out. People often ask me 'are you taking your day off?', 'have you booked your leave?' My supervisors, my college tutors and other Ministers all warn me that I need to guard my time off, or I will become burnt out and no use to the people I care for. I had always known this was important in my previous working life, but hadn't realised how hard it can be when you are in church ministry and, to all intents and purposes, your diary is yours to organise, but there are so many competing calls on your time to juggle and so much that just has to happen. Not everyone is understanding of the need for other's time off either, which adds its own pressure.

This is of course not unique to ministry. Many of you will have (or have had) careers and jobs that are very demanding, or are self-employed or working on zero hours contracts and feel the pressure of the need to keep things going and bring the money in. Many will also volunteer in your communities on top of busy working lives, or have filled retirement with such service. If we are not careful the busyness can catch up with us, or we can see work as an extreme competitive sport, or we can think ourselves indispensable.

When these temptations loom I am reminded of the example of Jesus. I often think when I read the stories in the Gospels that his life must have been constantly filled with noise and bustle and people demanding his attention. There was a lot to do, people needing healing of mind, body and spirit, a message of Good News to tell the world and disciples to train up to carry on the work. The stories tell us that large crowds followed him around all the time and were camped outside whichever house he was staying in; the pressure must have been immense. On one occasion, he had just been told that his cousin John has been brutally executed and decides to take some time to himself on the other side of Lake Galilee, but when he gets there the crowds have got there before him and are waiting on the beach. Once again he is there for them, heals their sick and teaches them. But once it quietens down he goes for that much needed break up a mountain, to talk to his Father.

Jesus knew that he needed rest and recuperation, sleep, times with friends and time with his Father God in order to refuel himself for the next period of work. The stories are punctuated with occasions where he goes for a boat ride, a walk up a mountain, a meal with friends, or has a nap. And we need these things too. All work and no play don't just make Jack or Jill dull, but also potentially exhausted, depressed and out of touch with family and friends.

Summer is often a time for thinking about time off and I hope that you will have the opportunity, if not for a holiday, then at least for an odd day out, drink with friends, walk in the countryside, or sit (hopefully) in the sunshine in your garden or the local park. It's worth trying spending time with our Father God too – just talking as you would to a friend, no big words needed, you can tell God anything – and if you listen to the quiet and also to the noise of life you may hear God responding too.

### **BULKINGTON VILLAGE HALL**





### **SEEND PARISH COUNCIL**

*N.B. These notes are from the draft minutes of Parish Council meetings, and may not yet have been ratified. Full copies of Parish Council meeting minutes can be found on [www.seendparishcouncil.co.uk](http://www.seendparishcouncil.co.uk)*

The meeting held on **Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> May 2016** was attended by 10 Councillors with Mr T Murch (Chairman) in the chair. Apologies received from PCSO Helen Wilson; also present Cllr J Seed and members of the public.

Prior to the public meeting, there was a closed session with Claire Crawford (Financial Director – Aster Homes); Lindsey Aldington (Project Leader – Aster Homes) and Paul Thomas (Planning Consultant).

Ms Crawford outlined the background to the requested meeting. Aster Homes has negotiated an option to purchase the **SHLAA site 1081 situated behind the Lye Field** from the landowner, this option is dependent upon them gaining planning permission within five years. The intention is to build private homes for sale, in order to fund the building of homes to rent. The problem that Aster Homes has is finding sites to purchase, as they have to compete with large building companies. There is no access to the site except through the existing estate; they have no pre-conceived ideas of what will go on the site. Councillors suggested it would be best to wait until the results of the recent Housing Needs Survey are known.

Cllr Seed advised that Wiltshire is 2,000 houses short of its target, and this is not likely to be addressed before the autumn. It could be better to accept a smaller development, in order to defend against a larger development being proposed. Any planning application would need to include 30% affordable housing.

The Chairman thanked the representatives from Aster Homes for having a dialogue with the Parish Council at an early stage, and advised that there had been a consultation in the village last summer, which indicated that residents preferred the SHLAA site option just off School Road. There were comments from Councillors about the impact access to the site behind The Lye would have on the A361.

The representatives of Aster Homes indicated that they are happy that their involvement is in the public domain. There is no indication at present how many houses are proposed, or how Aster see the access working.

It was **proposed** that when the Housing Needs Survey is ready, an extraordinary meeting should be called.

**Report received by email from PCSO Helen Wilson.** Between 7<sup>th</sup> -10<sup>th</sup> May, a trailer and mini digger were stolen, believed to be from G & S Patios. On 9<sup>th</sup> May an unknown male was seen trying car doors in Seend; CCTV footage had been circulated in local papers and on social media. On 20<sup>th</sup> May a serious traffic accident occurred at The Stocks. There was also a report on the Melksham NPT and changes that have taken place; this has been circulated to Parish Councillors.

Cllr Seed had met with the Chairman the previous week. Cllr Seed reported that the **installation of the VAS signs** at the High Street pinch point had been delayed until August, because of school exams; the work would be completed before the village fête weekend. There is an Area Board meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> June, community grants should be submitted for the September meeting. It was suggested that when the installation of the VAS signs takes place, there should be signs at either end advising “Businesses & Village shop open as usual”. Mr Wood proposed a diversionary route be advised at Semington roundabout for HGVs whilst the VAS installation work takes place.

Mr Wood asked about the clearance of land at the **SHLAA site acquired by Persimmon Homes** just off School Road. Cllr Seed thinks they will come forward with an application fairly quickly. The Chairman asked Cllr Seed for a contact with Persimmon Homes. Mr Wood suggested the PC asks them to come in for a meeting.

Email received from a resident of Cooks Close, concerning the **street lighting**, and asking whether the street light positioned outside her house could be timed to switch off at midnight and come on again at 5 am if required. Mr Wood agreed to deliver a letter to each house in Cooks Close, in order to gauge the views of all residents. It was suggested there should be a parish lighting survey.

**C & RT.** Nothing further has been received from Mark Evans since his email of 26<sup>th</sup> April. The Clerk was asked to write to Paul Kelly at the C & RT, and thank him for the way in which the work on the bridge at the Barge Inn had been undertaken. Mr James commented that now that the work was finished, several cars were parking on the newly seeded verge approaching the bridge, causing damage, and this was not acceptable. Cllr Seed to be asked if he could follow up enquiries about the responsibilities of the C & RT with Claire Perry.

**Defibrillation unit in village.** An email has been sent to Martin Render at Community Heartbeat Trust; he had sent information by email which had been circulated to Councillors. Mr Rigg questioned whether there was value in installing defib units. Mr Wood agreed to investigate other options for installation, and what other villages had done. It was suggested that funding could be sought from local businesses, and an application made for grant funding from the Area Board.

**Tree matters.** This matter is now with Katie Lloyd (Natural England Officer), and she is liaising with Highways about the best method to deal with the area. A site visit had been undertaken by Katie Lloyd with the Parish Clerk. The Clerk to follow up with Katie Lloyd, as the Parish Council may wish to take further action.

**Lye Field Play Equipment.** The Chair reported that he was meeting the following evening with Ric Ellinger and Steve Vaux regarding the play equipment on the Lye Field. He will reiterate the PC's previous response, but also that the PC does not want to see the play equipment lost.

Mrs A'Bear was awaiting the **Housing Needs Survey report**, and hoped that it would be a public document by the next meeting. She said that Seend now has an emerging Neighbourhood Plan. She has written to community stakeholders and has received 2 responses; responses have to be returned by 30<sup>th</sup> June.

The Agreement with **Sandridge Solar** had been signed last year. However, there had been additional clauses added when the proposed boundary changes with Melksham Without were being negotiated last autumn. The new agreement had now been received. Mr Wood agreed to go through the document, to see if the proposed community fund grant was index linked. The Clerk to contact Melksham WO PC, to ask what percentage they are receiving.

Local residents were present at the meeting, and expressed concern that Persimmon Homes intended to build on the **School Road site**, as it had been used for landfill and was contaminated; a previous plan to build on the site in 1993/4 was dropped because of this. The Chairman advised that it was the intention of the Parish Council to invite a representative from Persimmon Homes to come and talk to the Parish Council.

It was again suggested that the **layby at The Stocks junction** be shortened to improve visibility. It was suggested there should be a 30 mph limit at **Baldham Bridge**. It was noted that a speed gun was being used by Police in the village four weeks ago. Clerk to write to the Independent Police Commissioner, Angus McPherson, to ask Wiltshire's position on **speed cameras and speed guns**.

We shall be publishing brief profiles of **Seend Parish Councillors** in coming editions of Spotlight. Here's the first one:

### **GEORGINA A'BEAR - PROFILE**

My early years were spent in and around Chippenham and in the mid-eighties I met my husband through Young Farmers. I qualified as a Veterinary Nurse and after several years I had a change in direction and worked in an Accountants in Devizes and then went on to be a self-employed bookkeeper.

I moved to the village in 1987 and have been Treasurer for Seend Playgroup and a committee member for Friends of Seend School plus helping with the Youth Club. I have had a long involvement with The Rare Breeds Survival Trust Wiltshire and recently I have been a Junior Leader for Melksham Young Farmers.

I enjoy walking and riding around the Parish. I was co-opted onto Seend Parish Council in 2010 and am also the Chair of Seend Parish Neighbourhood Plan.

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### **WILTSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS FROM JONATHON SEED**

Many residents often raise the issue of highways maintenance to me and I am pleased to be able to report that a new Parish Steward service will be operated by our new highways contractors (Ringway) from October of this year. This service will run in parallel to the operation of the My Wiltshire reporting system which many of us use regularly. The key elements of the new Parish Steward system are:

- All statutory highways and other requirements should be reported using the My Wiltshire system(e.g. potholes).
- The Parish Steward service is for discretionary highways issues only - on roads, verges, ditches, footways, byways etc.
- Each Parish Council presents a rolling list of FIVE tasks in order of priority that they would like the Parish Steward to undertake.
- Most Parishes will be allocated one dedicated day each month from their Steward to do the work (some larger parishes might get more days). This allocation will be fixed in the first year and will be reviewed thereafter depending on demand.
- Each Parish Steward will be provided with a brand new, high-visibility pick-up truck complete with the tools and equipment needed to provide essential works such as strimming, hedge cutting, instant road repairs, drain clearing, painting, sign cleaning/repairs etc. They can also call on larger plant such as tractor-mowers, gully tankers and grip cutters if required.
- It is important that each Parish Council designates only one person as the point of contact, who then liaises with an Area Engineer but then on-site with the Parish Steward themselves if required.
- Resilience and reliability have been built into the service by not programming Fridays (to allow work to be completed from other weekdays and allow for sickness and training) nor the whole of May (in order to manage surge in seasonal growth), nor August (holiday season).

Locally I continue to work closely with the Parish Council on a whole range of matters including planning and community grants. This month we are looking together at potential development sites around the village of Seend.

I would like to conclude my monthly news by recording my deep sadness at the passing away of my great friend and political ally Joan Savage. Her community contribution as a former County Councillor, Parish Council Chairman and Parish Councillor was enormous. Joan was also a doughty political campaigner who will be greatly missed by her Party, her community and her many friends.
