Local Councillor's Matters	2024/25 Council Tax Wiltshire Council Budget is about to be finialised. Despite financial cuts from Central Government to the Rural Services Grant and increased Employer National Insurance charges, the Council is expected to increases Tax's by ~3.5% which is below the maximum Wilshire could demand. English Devolution Bill The Bill creates a new framework for English devolution, moving power from Westminster back to those who know their areas best. One of the first steps in the process is for regions to form Mayoral Authorities. Once formed these Authorities will receive addition government funding. Wilshire Council is exploring the opportunity of such a partnership with Devon, Somerset, Bournemouth & Christchurch. Public services such as Police, Fire & Ambulance will be shared between these councils.

Local Highways & Footpath Infrastructure Group (LHFIG)	Barge Bridge Parking Restrictions New Parking Restrictions either side of the Barge Bride are due to be implemented Spring 2025.			
	Spout Lane Parking Restrictions Wiltshire Council will not consider a Residential Parking Scheme at this location. Although waiting restrictions could be considered, the Parish Council and Local residents would need to agree what they could accept. One option would be for a 'staggered' 2-hour restriction during the middle of the day on opposite side of the road. i.e. (10.00 – 12.00 west side) (13.00 – 15.00 east side). This would deter those wishing to park continually for 24 hours.			
	Bell Hill Crossroads More substantial Bollards to be deployed. A Works Order has been issued. Installation date to be confirmed but expected within the next 4 months.			
	An incident at the Bell Sunday 26 th January involved a White Van leaving the road. Police were in attendance. The Clerk to request the Police Log reference.	Clerk		
	High Street Railings between School Lane and Dial Close. The Parish Council has been asked to confirm it would like to progress this requirement on the understanding that it will reduce the available pedestrian width of the footpath making it potentially difficult for Wheelchair and pushchair users. A Feasibility study will be required (estimated cost c£4.5k) of which the PC would need to fund 25% (~£1.2k)

	The applicant responded to these concerns explaining that this is an Outline	
	Planning application and they have been trying to source a local site for nearly 6	
	years and spent more than £100k working with Wiltshire Council to try and	
	secure a suitable location. Due to the items the Distribution Centre carries, there	
	is strict criteria regarding its location. Wiltshire Council has not designated	
	enough Employment / Industrial Land for medium size enterprises such as Gompels to grow. Land that could have been designated as 'Employment /	
	Industrial' was not identified by the Council in time to prevent house developers	
	and private companies securing most of the available local land for future	
	residential housing development.	
	The company faces a crisis in that unless it expands in-line with its customers	
	growth, it will lose its business.	
	The company has completed a full landscape impact assessment with a plan to	
	screen the warehouse with tall trees and hedging. Provision has been made to	
	increase bio diversity and additional drainage is included in the design to ensure	
	the existing water table does not rise and may actually be slightly lower.	
	The operation is expected to generate an average vehicle movement increase of	
	200 vehicles / day Mon – Friday (7am – 7pm) making a total increase of 1000	
	vehicle / movements a week.	
	The applicant advised he has been approached by 16 Developers to secure the	
	land for up to 200 houses. This could generate up to 2000 vehicle movements/day equivalent 14,000 vehicle movements/week.	
	Parish Councillors initial comments	
	The Parish Council's Planning Sub Committee was given a presentation by the	
	company about its plans to create a Distribution Centre at this location but has not previously commented on the proposal.	
	Councillors shared some of the concerns raised and noted this is a very difficult	
	planning decision to make. Given time, it is believed that although the building	
	could be screened, it is very high and perhaps a compromise could be found by	
	lowering the overall height of the building by covering a larger land area. The	
	Parish Council's understanding is that Gompels have looked at more than 20

	sites with what appears to have been little urgency or desire to assist by Wiltshire Council.	
	There was a suggestion regarding some recreational land adjacent Gompels present site which may have been purchased by Melksham Council could be exchanged to create the space needed for a new Distribution Centre.	
	Wiltshire Council appears not to have fully understood the Company's plight. Gompels has been a local success and is a growing company. All of their employees are directly employed and they have been supportive of their local staff.	
	The Parish Council recognises the company has been forced into difficult position and without Wiltshire Council's support it will ultimately be a choice between jobs or housing. It is a decision the applicant did not want and one the Parish Council feels would have been unnecessary had Wiltshire Council fully considered the long term needs of its locally based medium sized enterprises.	
	It also calls into question the value of local Neighbourhood Plans as it appears these may be sidelined. Guidance for creation of such plans may need to be revised to include provision of 'Employment' land so that people can have the opportunity to live and work within the same community area without having to travel.	
	The Parish Council will consider the points made and formally comment in due course.
