	Application Ref: PL/2022/01750 Site Location: 56 Sells Green, SN12 6RW Proposal: Development of rear Garden, 2 x Semi-detached three-bed property and 1 x Detached three-bed property. As the Applicant had no prior engagement with the Parish Council it was difficult to understand how the proposed development complies with the Neighbourhood Plan or current sustainability requirements. Design and Access Statements have not been included. The overall impression is, this is an overdevelopment of the site and not in keeping with the character or form of adjacent properties. The proposed building height and window locations would have adverse impact on adjacent properties. Parking within Spout Lane is at capacity with visitors and local residents having to resort to passing places further along Spout Lane providing overspill parking. The creation of a new driveway entrance will further compound this issue. The plan suggests 8 parking spaces will be included within the development. However, the Parish Council believes this to be insufficient for the 3 x 3-bedroom properties for the new residents, their visitors and the reduced parking on Spout Lane due to the new driveway entrance. This section of the lane is prone to a number of large vehicles (Caravan, Camper Vans, Service Lorries) accessing the neighbouring Caravan Park. The new driveway entrance could introduce an additional hazard as it potentially opens on to a busy narrow lane with parked cars on either side restricting driver visibility for both those emerging from the development and those traversing the lane.
