VICAR'S LETTER

Endings ... and beginnings

In my letter to you last month I confirmed I will shortly be leaving our parishes. My last service will be on Easter Day (5th April). It will be really good to see as many friends as possible on that occasion so I hope to see you there! Please give others a lift up to church if you can, to help with parking. Leaving the parishes will be so hard for me, as this has been the happiest time of my life. You have all made me so welcome and have become good friends. I have been truly blessed in my ministry here – for which I Praise the Lord, and thank you.

It might seem Easter Day is a rather peculiar day on which to have my final service. However, all clergy are now required to retire at 70 - the new 50, you understand! — which great age I will reach this month (March). I could hardly leave in the middle of Lent and so Easter Sunday — a day of great joy, as we celebrate the risen Lord and the beginning of new life — seemed a good choice for a timely exit! As I mentioned last month, you will not be left without help, because an "interim minister" is to be appointed for the foreseeable future.

Our Benefice ("churchspeak" for our group of parishes – Seend, Bulkington and Poulshot) is currently enjoying an informal link with our neighbouring ones of Potterne and Worton with Marston, and Bromham, Rowde and Sandy Lane. This Cluster grouping is beginning to work very well indeed as we enjoy meeting at joint services and share teaching/learning opportunities, quiet days and, hopefully, social occasions. Maureen has already published the first "Cluster News", which has been circulated to Cluster representatives and the churches involved. And so we now look for new beginnings – a change of "Vicar" and a change of thrust as we gear ourselves up a notch for bigger and better things within our church communities. Worshipping with other believers matters because it reminds us of the important things about God – His Word, His will, His ways, His promises, His call, His grace and His family. May he bless you all for being my "family" these past few years.



SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

N.B. These notes are from the draft minutes of Parish Council meetings, and may not yet have been ratified.

The meeting held on **Tuesday 24th February 2015** was attended by eight Councillors with Mr. J. Padfield in the chair. Apologies received from Mr K Rigg, Cllr J. Seed and CBM PC Emily Thomas.

Following last month's PC meeting, the High Street traffic management scheme was discussed at the CATG meeting held on 5th February. The CATG was advised that

the Parish's preference is for intelligent signs that warn of oncoming vehicles (similar to West Lavington). Costs for two signs with sensors would be approximately £20K, including installation work. The CATG's proposal is for the Parish, CATG and Area Board to pay one-third of the capital cost of the signage (£8,500). Therefore the PC would be asked to fund £2,833. Councillors discussed this proposal and voted 7 in favour and 1 against.

PC Thomas was unable to attend the meeting, but sent a report by email. On 8th February a folding bike was taken from a barge moored outside the Barge Inn. On 9th February fence posts were pulled out and criminal damage to a field at Seend Park Farm, Semington. On 17th February there was an attempted break in at Poulshot Road in the late evening, unknown male scared off by the owner's dog.

Parking in School Road – Email received from head Teacher, Jackie Chalk, to advise that she is aware of the congestion outside the school and regularly reminds parents of the need to park without blocking driveways in both School Road and Dial Close. She will raise the matter again at the next governors' meeting and contact parents again.

Car parking, Rusty Lane –Old correspondence relating to ownership of the lane and responsibility for upkeep has been located. It appears that the area in question is owned by three groups: Lye Field, WI and the Community Centre. It will be necessary to obtain agreement of the owners to improvements in the surface of the car park.

Noticeboard outside Post Office – this is undergoing renovation and will be replaced in due course.

Skateboard area – Mr Murch reported that the Lye Field Committee members are very busy at present dealing with Mr Macdonald's claim, and there may be financial implications for them; at present they don't feel they can be involved.

Footpaths 24 and 55 – The Rights of Way Warden asked if footpath 24 is a well walked footpath, and would it benefit from the broken stile being replaced with a kissing gate, subject to land owner approval? If so, would the Parish Council be able to part fund this? Councillors agreed to fund the kissing gate, however, they could not fund any further replacements in this financial year. The Rights of Way Warden advised that footpath 55 is an un-surfaced bridleway and whilst the ditches being dug out would help, the only way to improve the surface would be to lay road planings on it, would the Parish Council support this? Councillors agreed provided the landowner was in agreement, and there was no cost to the Parish Council.

Accidents on the C20 - Mr Manning advised that information had been sought from Wiltshire Police on accident statistics for the C20, and they are duty bound to respond within 20 days. There have been four accidents on the C20 so far this year.

Councillors commented that they were generally in favour, provided this was used as access to parking at the property, and not used for car parking.

Councillors voted 7 in favour, 1 against.

Wiltshire House, High Street – Councillors were concerned at the number of vehicles parking on the verge outside this property that is currently undergoing renovation. The Clerk to try and contact the owners of the property or speak to the site manager.

Correspondence

Email from Sian Ferry, Canal & River Trust, in response to an enquiry about winter moorings. As with last year, there are no specific fixed winter mooring sites on the K&A this year. Instead, a 'general towpath permit' is available, which allows boaters to moor for up to 5 months at a valid towpath location anywhere on the canal network (restrictions do apply: Boats can't stay for more than the signposted time on visitor moorings, within 1km of a private marina/mooring or within 500m of a CRT long term mooring site, and some other specific localised restrictions). Info on the general towpath permit and restrictions available on line at

https://canalrivertrust.org.uk/boating/mooring/winter-moorings

Regarding the K&A specifically, we have created a map which shows stretches where boaters cannot moor (marked in orange here:

https://canalrivertrust.org.uk/media/library/7505-k-and-

alocalplanareageneraltowpathwintermooringexclusionareas.pdf, based on the 1km/500m rule – Please note that visitor moorings are not marked on the map, but the above-mentioned restriction re stay times applies. It seems, from the K&A maps that Seend does not fall within an exclusion zone, so boaters would be able to moor along the towpath for extended periods in the area with a general towpath permit. However, if there is a specific towpath location you wish to query, please do let me know and I can consult with my colleagues local to that area.

Councillors queried whether people resident on boats on the canal were subject to Community Charge, the Clerk to check with Wiltshire Council. Also, which months are considered the five winter months, the Clerk to check with the Canal & River Trust.

The Clerk had been contacted by Wessex Water, who would like the speed limit from Seend Fork west to the village gateway to be reduced from 50 mph to 30 mph, to make exiting from the entrance to the sewage works on Seend Hill safer. They had contacted local residents and also Wiltshire Council, who advised that the Parish Council should ask for the speed limit to be assessed and reviewed through the CATG. Councillors agreed with this proposal. The Clerk to contact the Area Board.

Overgrown hedges – it was noted that hedges in the High Street were again impinging on the pavement. The Clerk to write to householders asking them to cut them back level with the wall.

Springs in Seend Cleeve – it was noted that these are again running across the road, but there is little that can be done to prevent.

Flood defence – Mr Wiltshire reported that the ton of sand and sand bags had been delivered by Wiltshire Council.

Seend Shuttle – the old bus had been sold to Melksham Area Youth Group for a nominal fee.

Parish boundary at Bowerhill – Melksham Without PC had been in contact to advise that they had installed a bench near the picnic area on the canal. This item to go on the agenda for the next meeting.

Sandridge Solar Farm – it was reported that the Planning Inspector had visited 10 days ago.

Wiltshire Council News from Jonathon Seed

Wiltshire Council passed its budget last month and will now be delivering services with £30 million less funding from Westminster and with the prospect of similar next year - whichever party wins the general election. So Wiltshire Council now settles down to work and the delivery of services, but now with a refreshed team as the Leader made changes to her Cabinet straight after the Budget. The changes include the inclusion of a new Cabinet Member to deliver solely on Highways and Transport issues. I have taken on the large housing portfolio to add to leisure, libraries and flooding, and my campus and community responsibilities pass to the Deputy Leader. I really look forward to overseeing the 5500 houses that the Council owns as well as delivering new ones to meet the County's housing needs.

Good news for our area has come out of the reorganisation of our Wiltshire Council youth services. There is more money available for youth projects, we have established a Local Youth Network (LYN) to deliver youth services and youth projects and we have an excellent youth officer in Ceri Evans who is dedicated to delivering these services and projects for the first time across the whole of our community area. Ceri is very keen to work in our rural villages and to try help provide activity for our 13 to 19 year olds, who in my opinion have been forgotten up to now. The old Seend community minibus has been taken over by the Melksham Youth charity and will now be available to collect and return any of our young people from Seend and Bulkington who want to go to the new LYN Youth Club in Melksham. It is early days and the mini bus is still short of volunteer drivers.

However this new youth service will be pretty much door to door every Tuesday evening and if it is to be a success it needs to be used so get in touch with Ceri at ceri.evans@wiltshire.gov.uk or call 07557322714 if you are interested.

Finally there is another service which could be very valuable to local residents with the introduction of the new Community Messaging service. You will have received a leaflet about it in last month's Spotlight. Visit www.wiltsmessaging.co.uk to sign in.

The search is now on to find 2000 volunteers to take part in the NPMS who will play a vital role in gathering information. Together the volunteers will monitor wild plants in 28 important habitats, ranging from hedgerows and meadows to salt marsh and scree slopes.
